

The show did not require hydraulics, lasers, fancy special effects, have a plethora of 4 letter words in the script or any of the many things Broadway shows today are becoming known for which make them very difficult for a community theatre to produce. This show had a fun plot, lots of a bit over the top characters and a lot of energy. It went right on my "someday I want to do that" show list. As luck would have it, the Playmakers Board of Directors was kind enough to trust me with directing *Thoroughly Modern Millie*.

The cast of this show has been a joy to work with. There are many faces you may recognize from other Playmakers productions and there are a lot of faces new to the Playmakers stage. *Thoroughly Modern Millie* is set in the Roaring Twenties, the age of gangsters, prohibition, jazz and the flapper.
